
SEAYLP Outcomes

- Originated in Illinois
 - Joliet Junior College, est. 1901, oldest continuously operating CC in U.S.

- NIU is the #1 transfer institution in Illinois
- NIU transfer students 55% of graduating students
- 85% of NIU grads have at least one semester of transfer credit
- 43% of SEA studies undergraduates from CC








Teaching SEA to Undergraduates Workshop





- 7 speakers and 1 student panel
