Now more than ever, we find ourselves reliant on eBooks and online databases to pursue our work as researchers, students, and scholars. OSU Libraries offers an abundance of e-resources, but sometimes the sheer volume can feel overwhelming. In this hands-on workshop, Japanese Studies Librarian Ann Marie Davis will demonstrate how to access such materials -- from Japanese eBooks (on new platforms like KinoDen), to major databases like Japan Knowledge and JKBooks (a specialized eBook platform with volumes of primary sources and antique texts). In addition, she will discuss National Diet Library digital collections, indexes to Japanese language articles, and much more. Ann Marie Davis is Assistant Professor and Japanese Studies Librarian at The Ohio State University. In her current position, she manages OSU's Japanese Studies Collections, including its world class Manga Collection, one of the largest collections of Japanese comics outside of Japan.
