Amid escalating US-China conflicts, U.S. and China imposed a series of sanctions against each other. Communities that have been involved in US-China trade, business or scientific collaborations are under scrutiny. This talk will illustrate the emerging US sanctions landscape and the strategies the affected communities could adopt.

1. The impact of emerging US sanctions on China in US-China Trade and Investment
2. A deep dive on Hong Kong related sanctions
3. Strategies and Risk management for business and scientific communities engaging in cross-continental trade and/or partnership in navigating the new sanction landscape.

**Wei He**, Ph.D. in Public Policy and Certified Global Sanctions Specialist, is a policy expert in sanctions, anti-money laundering (AML) and US export control related compliance. Her book *The Role of World Financial Institutions in Enforcing US Sanctions and AML* analyzes the sophisticated legislative and institutional settings that incentivise world financial institutions to assist the US in enforcing sanction related US foreign policies and laws. She founded the non-profit Infinity Institute and currently serves as the president.
