

*Build or enhance your tool chest to teach about East Asia through this introductory seminar. Participants will gain knowledge, resources, and expert guidance on incorporating East Asia in the classroom by engaging with experts and other educators in the field.*

This free professional development course is an introduction to the cultures of China, Japan, and Korea, with special emphasis on the ideas and cultural developments that make East Asia a distinct region. The seminar is designed to encourage and facilitate K-12 teaching and learning about East Asia in World History, Geography, Social Studies, Art, and World Literature. Media specialists, librarians, art teachers, world language teachers, and others are also well positioned to help foster a place for East Asia in your schools. Some class time will be devoted to group discussions of teaching materials and strategies appropriate for different teaching levels to incorporate or enhance your curriculum about East Asia.

36 hour online seminar includes:

- July 12 - 16 and July 19 - 23, 2021, daily 1:00 - 4:00pm
- Synchronous and Asynchronous sessions designed to optimize time together
