Global Social Justice Activism and Protests

This two-week seminar will inform K-12 teachers about global social justice activism and protest movements by focusing on the regions of East Asia, Eastern Europe/Eurasia, Latin America, and the Middle East. The seminar will give participants a solid foundation in the relevant political, social, and historical theories in order to ground their understanding of protests and politics.





Guest experts will present regional case studies to provide comparative perspectives of what are prominent current protest movements in their region of study, what hurdles activists/protestors experience when organizing events or demonstrations, the longer history and culture of protest in the particular region, how protestors and their movement are perceived in the larger population, and how the demands of activists/protestors are considered and/or met by policymakers and reverberate in the political sphere.
