DIVISIONS:

- High School (grades 9-12)
- Elementary/Middle School (grades K-8)

PRIZES (Each State and Division):

- First Place: \$250
- Second Place: \$150
- Each sponsoring teacher of place winners will receive \$100 of Korea-related materials

FLOW:

Line 1: Introduces subject/theme (Question)

Line 2: Develops subject/theme (Answer)

Line 3: Twist or anti-theme (twist/end)

Note: Grand Prize for KY/OH/WI!

RULES:

- Open to Ohio & Kentucky K-12 students.
- Students create original sijo poem.
- Submit Sijo online by May 1, 2022.

SYLLABLES/PAUSES:

- 3 lines, 4 sections per line (12 total)
- Major pause in middle of each line, small pause between other sections.
- 44-46 syllables total, 14-16 per line.
- Lines 1&2:
 - ◊ Similar syllable count and content
 - ◊ Syllables per section 3-4-3-4
- Line 3:
 - ◊ Different syllable count and content (twist)
 - ◊ Syllables per section 3-5-4-3
