Nuclear weapons have played an outsized role in shaping the security dynamics of the Korean Peninsula from the end of the Korean War to the present day. The security dynamic on the Korea peninsula is, once again, changing rapidly, this time as a conservative government in Seoul takes power and as Pyongyang resumes missile testing, them deployment of tactical nuclear weapons and prepares to conduct another nuclear explosion.
