FAR EAST DEEP SOUTH

A FILM SCREENING, WITH PRODUCER BALDWIN CHIU

Far East Deep South explores the seldom-told history of Chinese immigrants living in the American South during the late 1800s to mid-1900s through the eyes of Charles Chiu and his family as they travel from California to Mississippi to find answers about his father, K.C. Lou. The film provides a window into the lives of the Chinese in the South and the discrimination they faced in the midst of segregation. It not only highlights the struggles and perseverance of the Chinese, but explores the racial dynamics between the White, Black, and Chinese communities and the added challenge of exclusionary immigration policies, such as the Chinese Exclusion Act, many families faced at that time. After the film, producer Baldwin Chiu will offer comments, and opportunities for audience Q&A. Lunch will be provided to attendees.
