Currently the North Korean regime can be defined as an autocratic communist where an absolute ruler monopolizes decision-making by depending on a communist party or it can be also defined as a dynastic totalitarian where one family monopolizes political succession in totalitarian institutional mechanisms. Whatever definition. North Korean leaders have been the crux of social unity for decades, exercising absolute power.
