Abstract: This talk, based on a chapter of a current book manuscript, considers the Manchu poetry of Qing translator and inveterate complainer Jakdan. In addition to introducing the poetry itself, the talk will also discuss the methodological joys and challenges of translating this Manchu poet and writing at the interface of fiction and history.
