Yi Kwangsu, famous for publishing The Heartless (Mujŏng, 1917), Korea's first mature novel, for writing the February Eighth 1919 Student Declaration which sparked the anti-Japanese March First Movement, and later, for "betraying" the Korean people by collaborating with the colonial state. The Heartless's place in literary studies has often been obscured by the author's politics. This is a new, spatialized reading of the seminal work to reconsider Yi's alterity (Japan-Korea, city-hometown) as a precondition of modernity itself.
