Dr. Wang Zheng is a Research Scientist at the Institute for Research on Women and Gender and Professor of Women's Studies and History at the University of Michigan. Born in Shanghai, Professor Wang was a "sent-down youth" during the Cultural Revolution. Her research concerns feminism in China, both in terms of its historical development and its contemporary activism in global contexts, and the role of gender in state formation. She is the author of *Some of Us: Chinese Women Growing up in the Mao Era* and *Finding Women in the State: A Socialist Feminist Revolution in the People's Republic of China, 1949-1964*.
