This lecture will introduce the exhibition Cai Guo-Qiang: Cuyahoga River Lightning on view at the Cleveland Museum of Art from 25 May to 22 September, 2019. Dr von Spee will discuss the exhibition's concept and approach that involved collaborating with the Chinese-born contemporary artist Cai Guo-Qiang and commemorating a difficult moment in the history of the city of Cleveland: when the Cuyahoga River caught fire in 1969, and the ensuing recovery of its waterways. The challenge for Cai was to transform the historic event and the following clean-up endeavors into the language of his art. Cai Guo-Qiang's powerful explosion events and ignited gunpowder works offer visitors an inspiring visual experience and new ways of perceiving humankind and our relationship to nature.
